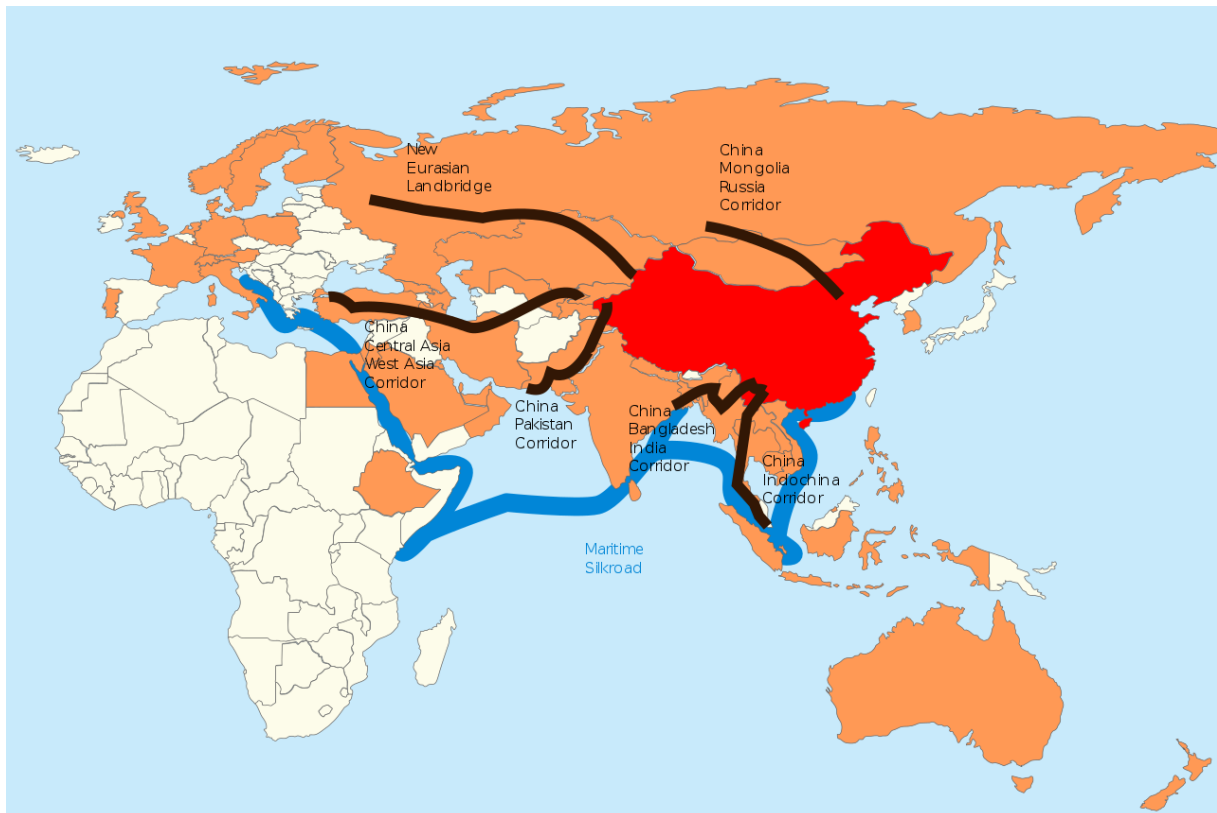
Appendix 2: Map of Central Asia²
