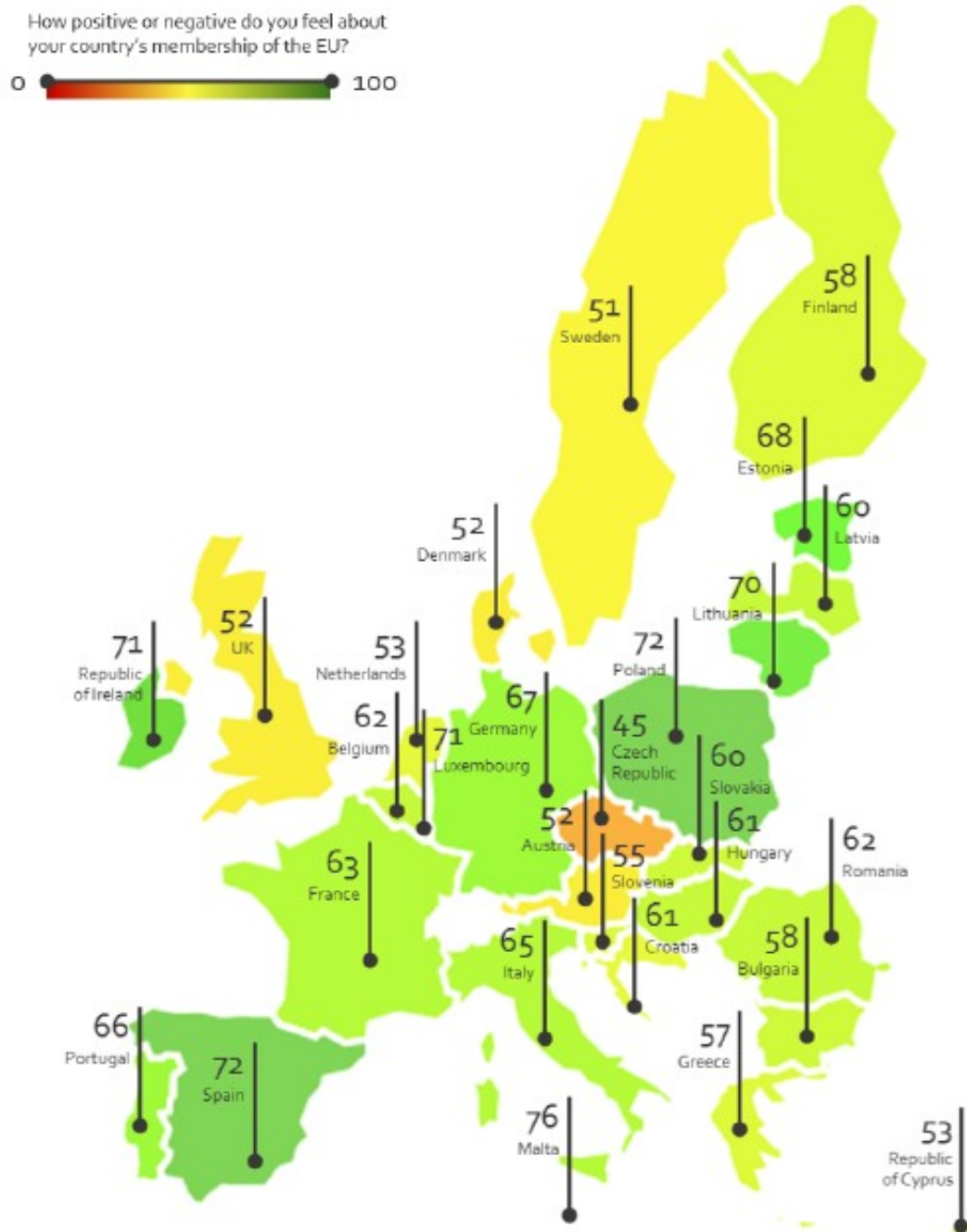


Figure 1: Euroscepticism of Czech citizens

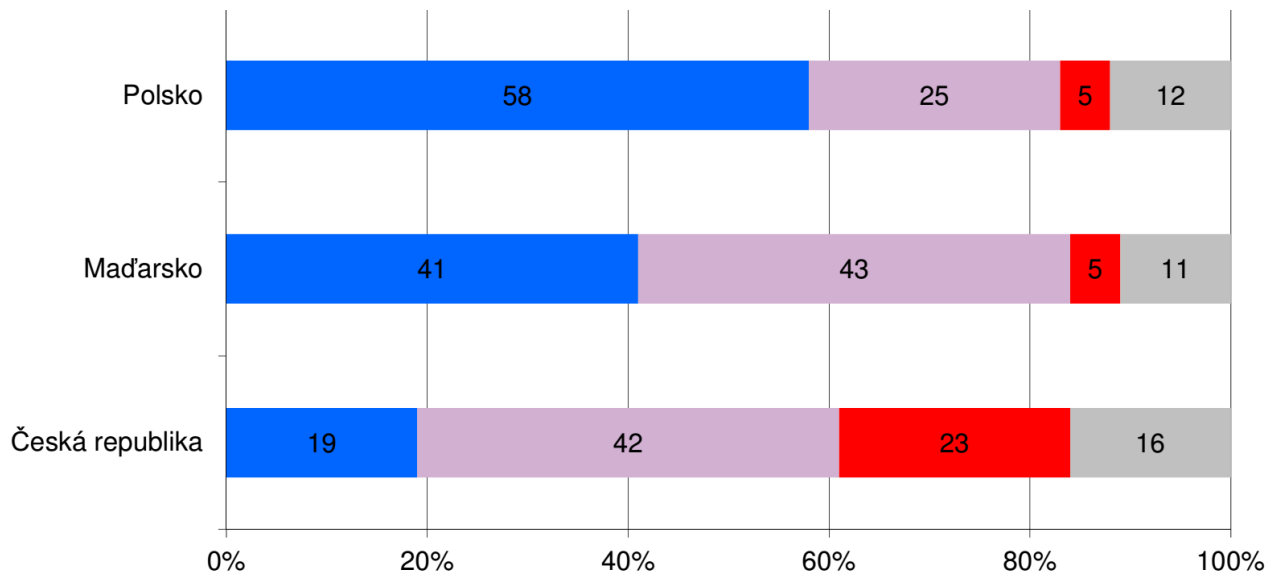


Figure 2: The opinion poll with the question: If the EU will split into „core“ and „periphery“, where do you see the appropriate place for your country?

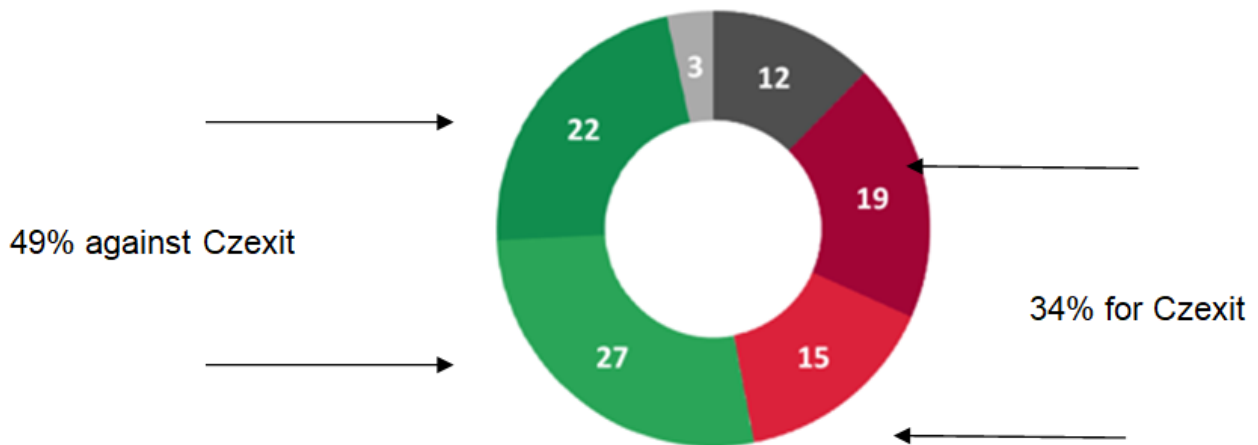


Figure 3: The support of Czech citizens to a possible “Czexit”

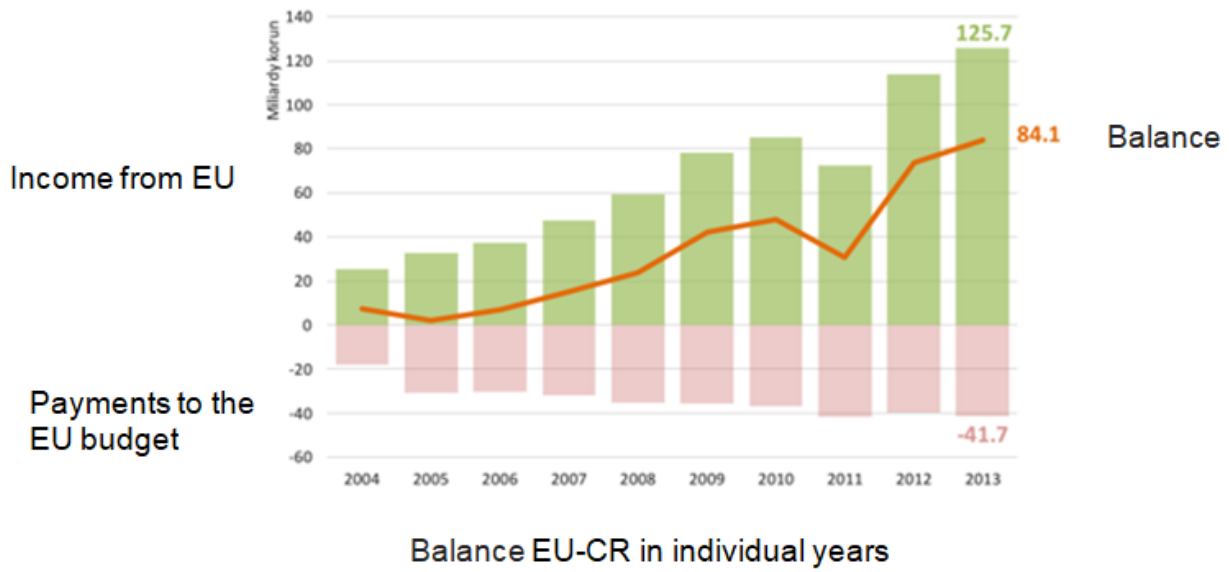


Figure 4: The balance of EU funding of the Czech society (green), contributions to the EU budget (pink) a overall balance (orange line)

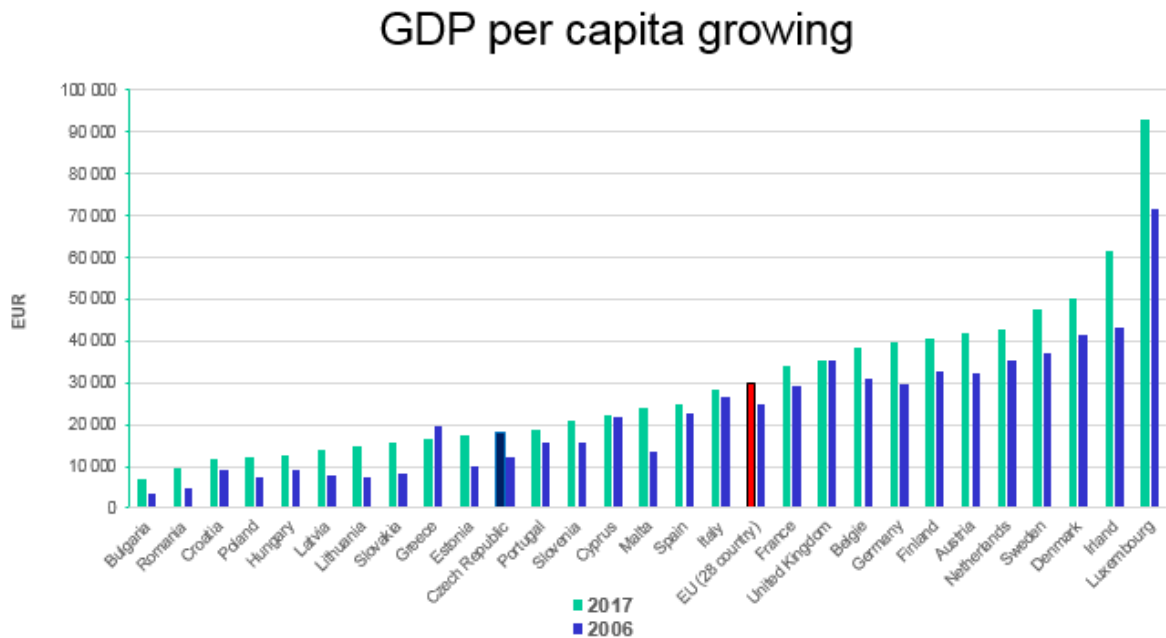


Figure 5: GDP per capita in different European countries

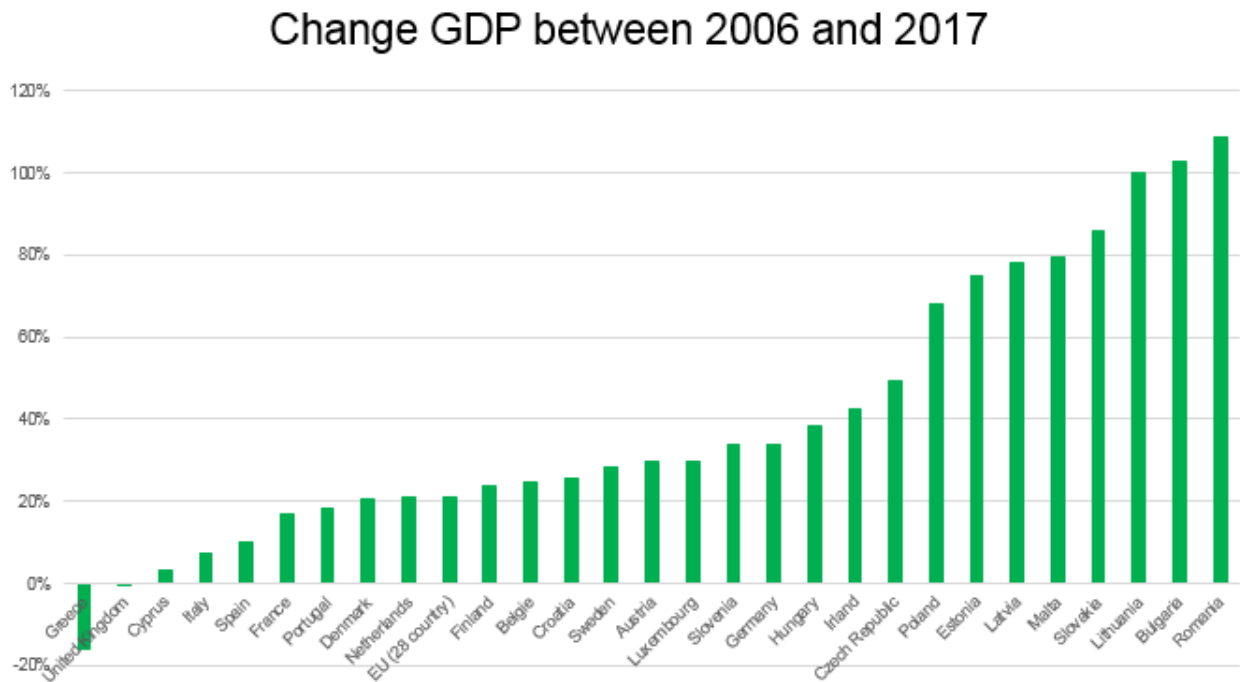


Figure 6: The relative GDP growth (2006-2017)

Salary at top of scale

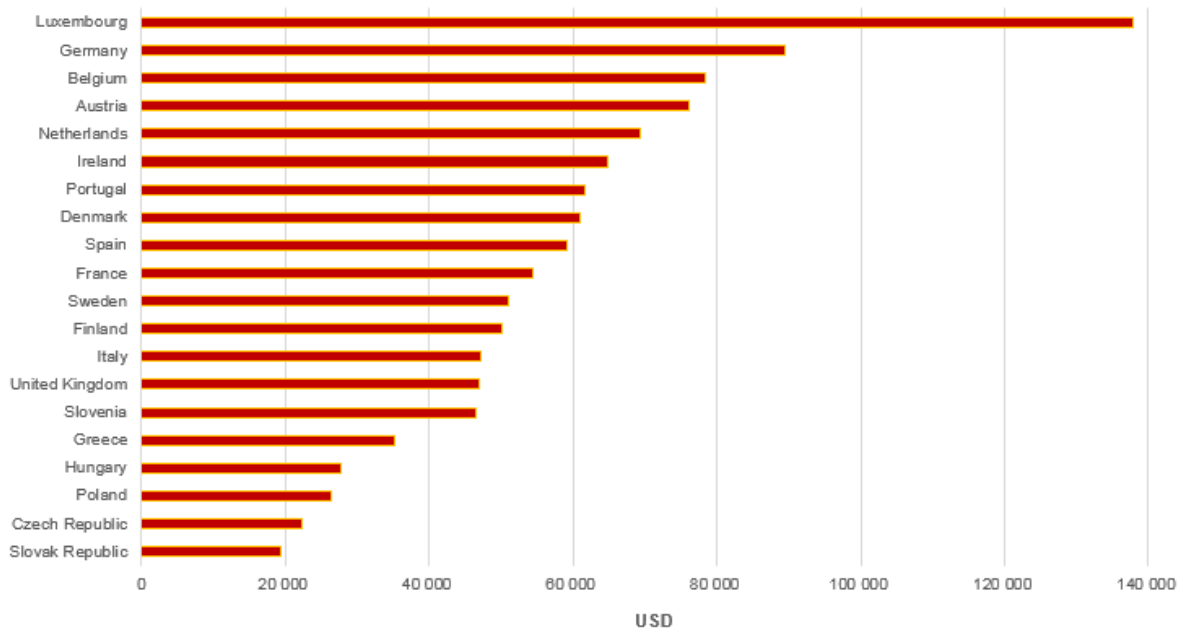


Figure 7: Comparison of teacher's salaries

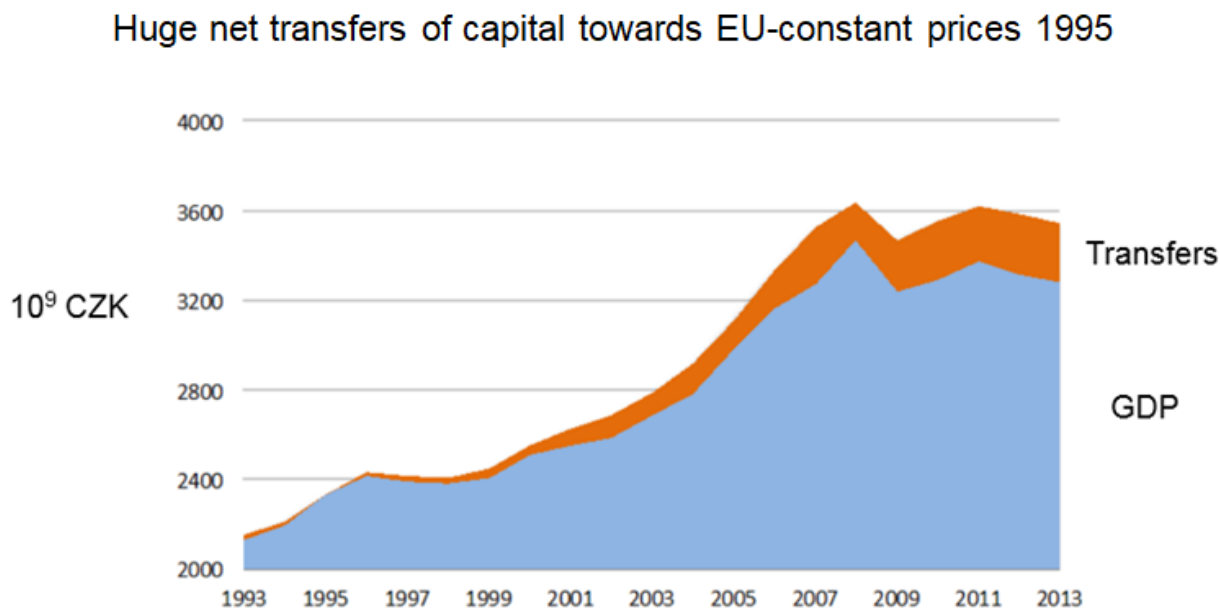


Figure 8: Transfer of profits from the CR abroad compared to the GDP (in billions of Czech crowns).

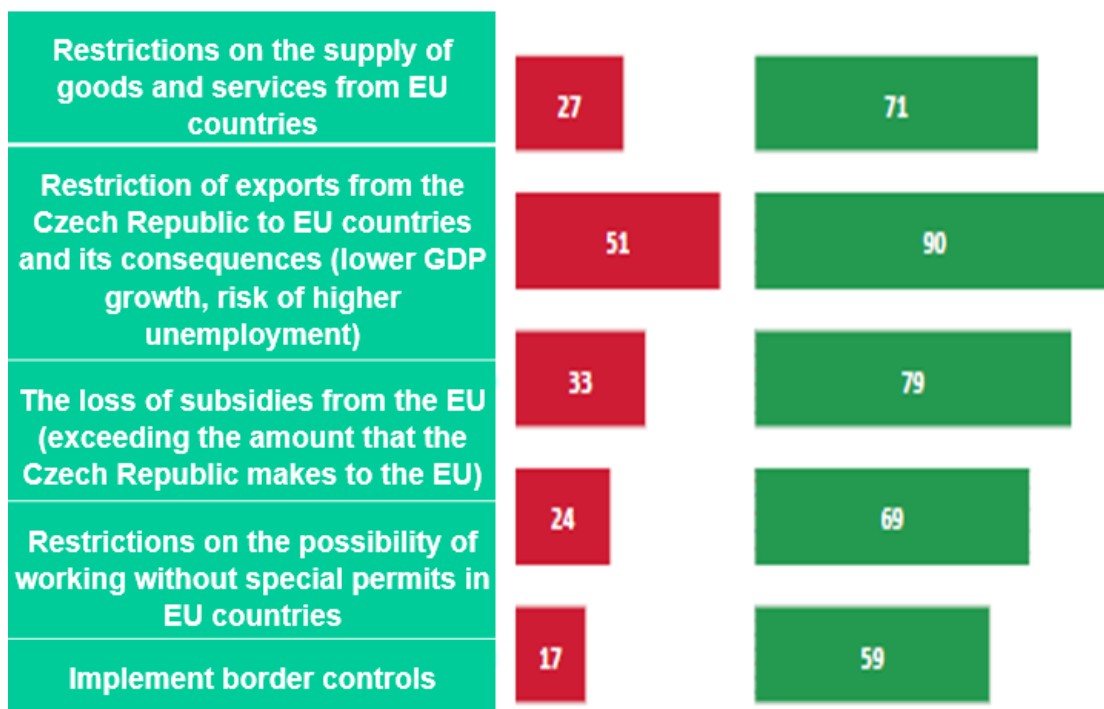


Figure 9: Expected outcome of potential leaving the EU.
